Broadclyst Parish Council constantly strives to work on behalf of parishioners on issues that matter to its residents, communities, stakeholders and local businesses.

Listed below is our current schedule of activity. This is regularly reviewed and updated as projects finish and priorities/policies change:-

Actions 2015/16 Financial Year

- Improvements to storage facility at the Broadclyst Pavilions to provide space for community self-help equipment
- Continued representation on the Joint Parish board to support the emergence of the Growth Point new communities including Cranbrook
- Creation of new role and the subsequent employment of a Parish 'man-Friday' to undertake the old role of handyman in conjunction with additional Road Warden duties
- Training Road and Flood Wardens
- Footpath survey
- Support the District Council in the consultation process and delivery of community infrastructure in strategic sites
- Community Engagement in new developments, encouraging integration with neighbouring settlements
- Creation of parish office

On-Going Actions

- Representation at County & District meetings where appropriate
- Highways Management – in collaboration with DCC Highways
- Representation at County & District meetings
- Community Grant Funding scheme to support community schemes and voluntary groups within the parish
- Consideration of and response to consultations on issues specifically affecting the parish now and in the future
- Respond to all planning consultations as consultees
- Ensure Community Emergency Plan is kept up to date
- Regular verge and footpath maintenance and cutting via Community Self-Help scheme
- Support subcommittee work which strives to address traffic issues
- Invite all village organisations and groups to the Annual Parish Meeting

- Provide administration for Annual Parish Meeting
- Keep all village message boards up to date
- Keep parish website up to date
- Use of social media to reach online parishioners with local news and community information
- Produce a quarterly newsletter (The Broadsheet) to Parish news and detail of Council, Community and stakeholder activity
- Control and management of parish public finances
- Review and update Council's operational policies and procedures
- Enable continuing professional development for staff
- Produce and ensure appropriate training programme for Clerk and Councillors
