Thank you for offering the opportunity to the Parish Council to choose street names for this pahse of the development. The names have been taken from a combination of field names on the tithe map and from the finds/materials in the archaeological dig.

Where the street name comprises two words we have not suggested a suffix. In keeping with Cranbrook and Old Park Farm phase 1 and 2 the only name with the suffix “road” is the main spine road which will run through this and the Mosshayne development.

We thought the roads shown in green were two separate roads rather than one street. If however this is to have one name right through we would prefer that Elmores Well be used.

### **“Spare” names**

There was a type of stone found in the archaeological dig named “Rougemont”. We did not put it forward as were unsure if the Post Office would feel there may be confusion with Rougemont Gardens in Exeter City Centre. However if there is not an issue with this, we would like to suggest it be considered as a spare name.

There is a field in this area named Little Meadow on the tithe map which we have not used. We could use it in later phases (there are lots of “little meadows”) or alternatively we would like to suggest it as a spare for this site.
