Travel Safely Every Day – BCP Road Safety Campaign

Motion 1

As part of the campaign we need banners highlighting the dangers caused by illegal parking.

I have asked the National Trust for permission to erect banners, 6ft x 2ft

- On The Green opposite the top of Town Hill.
- On the hedge at the top of Town Hill – resident has given permission
- On The Green opposite Clyst Caring

Motion 2

Ask D&C Police if it will **trial a school version** of Operation Snap during the school week.

Generations of children are growing up believing that illegal and dangerous parking and driving is acceptable – it is not.

Devon and Cornwall Police – road safety - Operation Snap

Operation Snap was set up in the region in 2019, it allows members of the public to submit video evidence of driving offences through an online portal. Footage can be submitted from numerous sources, whether it's a dashcam, helmet camera, mobile phone or even a video doorbell.

Since 2019, Devon & Cornwall Police has taken action against almost 10,000 motorists through Op Snap – all thanks to vigilant members of the public.

Why do we need Operation School Snap?

It is good to remember that Town Hill is the **only pedestrian access for 550 children** to the primary school. They are banned from entering on the B3181.

As well as parking on (3 times a day) on double yellows and opposite junctions drivers:

- Park facing traffic on the double yellows at the top of Town Hill then pull out as traffic is entering the street from the B3181 junction.
- Park on the double yellows at the top of Town Hill and reverse onto the B3181
- Make three point turns at the top of Town Hill – just metres from the B3181 junction.
- Make U turns on the B3181 junction with Town Hill
- Reverse from Hellings into Town Hill – next to the pedestrian crossing.
